## Significant Achievements

#### All the Way to the Supreme Court

A Coblentz attorney represented a man who was in county jail, awaiting trial, when a prison guard attacked him. After successfully defeating the county's quest for qualified immunity in a Ninth Circuit appeal, the matter was set to go to trial. The county then filed a petition for certiorari with the Supreme Court. Our attorney became a successful Supreme Court advocate, convincing the Court in a clear and compelling brief not to take the case.

#### **Criminal Justice Act Defense**

Coblentz attorneys took on two "Criminal Justice Act" federal criminal cases. In both cases, the defendants would otherwise have been unable to afford representation. In both cases, our attorneys were successful in navigating a complex and opaque pretrial system to secure fair and reasonable resolutions for our clients.

#### **Standing up for Eviction Rights**

Coblentz attorneys represented a low-income client facing eviction from his home. When settlement negotiations faltered, they prepared the case for trial in short order. On the day of trial, they leveraged a favorable settlement for the client.

#### **Tax Relief for Medi-Cal Recipient**

A Coblentz attorney assisted a taxpayer in a tentative favorable settlement of a tax court case involving Medi-Cal payments. We were able to persuade the IRS to accept the client's claim and offer a large concession.

#### **Removing Obstacles to the Transgender Community**

Coblentz partnered with the Transgender Law Center to host a free name and gender marker change clinic where our attorneys helped clinic participants with the process of identifying and completing the correct forms to complete a legal name and gender change. Our work helped participants overcome one obstacle in a complicated bureaucratic process.

#### **Continuing to Fight for Disabled Veteran's Benefits**

In 2018, a Coblentz attorney secured a substantial award of back pay for a disabled veteran, in conjunction with Swords to Plowshares. Although under an order to pay, the VA continued to delay, and the client still didn't have his money. After months of our continued relentless efforts into 2019, the VA finally paid the substantial settlement of retroactive benefits for the veteran.

#### **Debt Relief from Bail Bond Companies**

Coblentz attorneys staffed the "Our Fair Chance" legal clinic put on by the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights of the San Francisco Bay Area, where we assisted individuals saddled with unmanageable debt from for-profit bail bond companies following encounters with the criminal justice system and negotiated with bail bond companies for debt reduction or relief.
